The power of grassroots change






## GROWTH IN IMPACT



#### **2017 LEAGUE REVIEW**



GOALS' leagues are created on a community-interest basis. We now have four continuously operating leagues that take place in the spring and fall each year. 90% of our teams are from rural villages. Each team has 9-15 girls and plays competitive mini-football matches once a week.



2,310

In 2017 GOALS impacted 2,310 youth and educators from every region of Armenia through direct participation in our programming. This is more than triple our impact in 2016.

69

This year we worked in 64 different communities. Giving youth the opportunity to play soccer and meet other youth from surrounding villages. We are bringing communities closer with the power of sport.

6,153

Through our work with educators and youth we have indirectly impacted 6,153 Armenian nationals, many of whom held strong views regarding women in sports.

82%

of GOALS program participants feel more confident in their decisions and leadership abilities following participation in either one of our camps, leagues, or clubs based on questionnaire data.

## AFTER-SCHOOL CLUBS

Launched this Spring, GOALS
After-School Clubs aim to create
safe spaces for youth to discuss
important social issues like
gender equality, human rights,
and leadership through an
interactive on-the-field method.
These co-ed clubs seek to bridge
the gender gap in sport and in
society. Through dialogue and
awareness our clubs are changing
minds.

Every club targets youth aged 12-17 and is facilitated by a youth worker that has been trained by GOALS. All club participants partake in a 12-week course that takes place at least one hour per week. Our modules are specially designed for the Armenian social context and address key issues affecting youth in rural Armenia.

### From Hobby to Serious Player

In March 2017, Dsegh village participated in the opening league season of the GOALS Alaverdi girls' league. Prior to the league, there were no opportunities for girls to play soccer. Upon hearing about the league, one girl, Anahit quickly joined. Anahit said she always pursued football as a hobby but when she joined the league she "started to take soccer seriously and love it more." Through soccer she says she and her teammates have been able to "break through the stereotypes of the masses. Now we are happy we aren't underestimated." Anahit has played for a year now and will continue in 2018. While her team did not win the league, she says she cannot imagine her future without soccer. Taking the loss graciously she quoted, "what doesn't kill you makes you stronger."




## Annual Income Statement

#### **2018: LOOKING FORWARD**

Dear Supporters,

2018 will be a big year for GOALS. We already have the groundwork to open two new leagues- one in Shirak Marz and one in Kotayk Marz. These leagues will give the opportunity for more girls to participate in ongoing programming that supports their development. Additionally, we will be holding a second annual national tournament where each winning team has the change to travel to Yerevan and compete for the title of National Champion! These events are crucial for the empowerment of our participants and allow communities and girls from across the country come together in the name of soccer.

Aside from our league plans, we are working on opening fifteen new After-School Clubs, which will bring sport for social impact games to more communities and more youth. These co-ed environments allow participants a rare chance to play on the field together while discussing important social issues. We can't expect the youth to lead Armenia forward if they aren't talking to one another. Through these clubs youth are able to have fun and discuss, one of the many reasons we firmly believe in the power of sport to bridge the equality gap.

Furthermore, we are excited about growing partnership opportunities in 2018. We are already completing several partnership applications and jointly applying to programming for various cross-cultural events and tournaments. Bringing together local Armenian youth with diasporans and foreigners from across the world to play soccer brings so many more benefits to GOALS participants.

While our brand and programming spreads across Armenia we remain eternally grateful for all the support from our donors, fans, and partners. We love the work we do and appreciate every person who helps us to do it better and more effectively. We can't wait to bring our passion to more youth in Armenia in 2018!
